A NEW POTENTIAL ENERGY SURFACE FOR N $_2$ O-He, AND PIMC SIMULATIONS PROBING INFRARED SPECTRA AND SUPERFLUIDITY

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High resolution infrared spectra of an N₂O molecule seeded in ultra-cold helium custers have been reported by two groups.^{*a,b*} Early simulations of N₂O–(He)_{*n*} clusters^{*c,d*} were performed using potential energy surfaces (PESs) for which the dopant N₂O molecule was frozen at its equilibrium geometry. Since the evolution of the shift of the ν_3 band-origin of N₂O provides a key link to bridge the gap between micro and macro world, a new 3D PES was generated which incorporated the asymmetric-stretch Q_3 vibrational motion of the N₂O.^{*e*} Bosonic PIMC simulations^{*f*} based on this surface were then used to study rotational dynamics, and energetic and superfluid properties of N₂O–(He)_{*n*} clusters. The evolution of the calculated shifts agree reasonably with the experimental results, but some quantitative discrepancies remain. To address this problem, a new four-dimensional N₂O–He PES has now been obtained which also takes account of the change in the average value of the Q_1 symmetric-stretch coordinate on excitation of ν_3 . It has been fitted to a generalized MLR functional form^{*g*} which imposes better long-range behaviour. Results obtained using this new surface will be presented.

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
